

2004 Warren A. Hall Medal

The Warren A. Hall Medal is a memorial established by friends and family of Warren A. Hall to recognize unusual accomplishments and distinction of an individual in the water resources field. It was officially instituted in July 1992 by the Board of Directors of UCOWR. The Medal will be awarded at UCOWR's annual meeting.

A selection committee consisting of Chuck Howe, Miguel A. Marino, Daniel P. Loucks, and Vernon Snoeyink has been formed to consider a recipient for the 2004 Warren Hall Medal. Nominations, including supporting letters, are due at UCOWR Headquarters by February 23, 2004.

The recipient of the Warren A. Hall Medal is recognized for his or her unusual accomplishments and distinction in the water resources field. The recipient should be an educator, devoted to the advancement of knowledge in water resources (through teaching, research, and/or public service) and with a strong commitment to the education and welfare of his or her students. Only members of the UCOWR community are eligible to nominate a candidate for the Medal. The candidate, however, is not required to be affiliated with any specific organization; nor is he or she restricted to be of a specific discipline within the water resources field.

The letter of nomination should not exceed five single-spaced pages, and should include the resume of the candidate. At least three letters of recommendation must be received by the award committee for the candidate to be eligible for consideration for the Award; there is no limit, however, on the number of letters received on behalf of the candidate.
